As for the past, I would like to recall November 15, America Recycles Day! What a pleasure it was to connect with so many of you at Parks Library! Playing "What Recycles," and discussing how and where to recycle always brings a smile to my face. I so enjoy "talking trash" and learn something new with each conversation. Thank you for participating in the fun!

Looking to the future...during our discussions on November 15, some of you had questions about recycling in the City of Ames, as well as on-campus. I have news!!! Ames Resource Recovery Superintendent, Bill Schmitt, and Assistant Superintendent, Mark Peebler, are excited to share that starting December 1 the City of Ames will offer drop-off recycling at the Ames Resource Recovery Center (with more to come this spring)! Recycling bins will be available 24/7, 365 to drop off your plastics (#1-2 with twist-off tops... water bottles, plastic jars, detergent jugs, etc. - leave the lid on); mixed paper (newspaper, magazines, phone books, junk mail, color paper, cereal boxes, etc.); corrugated cardboard and metal (aluminum and tin food and beverage cans). These





additional recycling bins will be located alongside the current **glass recycling and food waste** drop-off bins, located on the northeast corner of the Center, located at 420 East Second Street.

Now... back to the present! Remember Cyclones, our goal is the Four R's (Rethink, Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) in minimizing our waste and maximizing our diversion from landfilling. Specifically related to recycling, bravo! Remember the recycling signage research project I mentioned in earlier newsletters this year? My initial research is showing great results to assist me in implementing campus wide messaging toward ensuring a successful "trash diet" in 2024!! Stay tuned!
