Starting January 29, lowa State will be participating for the fourth year, in a competition called "Campus Race to Zero Waste" (CRZW). The competition is focusing on how well colleges and universities recycle. It measures waste recycled versus landfilled, as its competitive measure.

At ISU, we utilize the competition also as research study is more to help us observe and understanding the practice of recycling on campus and any challenge areas or gaps. In past years lowa State has performed mid to average and sits about 49 out of 150 schools. For this year's CRZW we will be observing weights received at the MRF ((Materials Recycling Facility) – located in Ankeny), where we take our recyclables, vs. weights from the Ames Resource Recovery Plant and Boone County Landfill.

THE KEY - Please make sure that your recycling is clean! If contamination is prominent in the bin, sadly, the recycling effort has been wasted and all the bin contents will be added to the trash. If you have left over food, place it in a waste/trash bin - or compost bin, if you are in Frederiksen Court. If there is any liquid left in your recyclable beverage container, PLEASE dump it out before you recycle. If your pizza box has oil stains on it, tear off the stained part and throw it away and recycle the rest. Everyone's help is needed in keeping our recycling clean. Think before you throw!
